MOSTe empowers underserved girls in Los Angeles to realize their strengths and goals, build their confidence and explore careers, and ultimately graduate from college. Thanks to our dedicated mentors, partners, and volunteers, we have nurtured the aspirations of over 100 girls in underserved communities of Los Angeles in 2022-2023.

By collaboratively working with 6 middle schools, over 43 high schools, and more than 28 colleges nationwide, we have established a robust network of educators, mentors, and volunteers to aid our students in achieving their dreams. We remain committed to ensuring every MOSTe scholar successfully graduates from college.

76% of MOSTe alumnae have graduated college within 6 years, compared to only 11% for students of similar backgrounds.

Scholars' Awareness of Resources



85%

MOSTe achieved remarkable success in enhancing scholars' awareness of resources available to help them pursue their goals. This awareness increased by 18%, rising from 71% at the beginning of the year to 85% by the end of the year.

Scholars' Sense of Community



By actively engaging in the MOSTe program, scholars experienced a significant boost in their sense of community connection, going from an initial rate of 42% at the beginning of the year to 58% by the end of the year.

Strength of Mentor/Scholar Relationships



MOSTe establishes and cultivates meaningful, highquality relationships between scholars and mentors. These relationships saw a remarkable improvement in quality during the year, with an increase of 24%, from an initial rating of 75% to an impressive 93%.

Scholars' Sense of Isolation and Loneliness

Over the course of the year, MOSTe scholars experienced a remarkable reduction in their feelings of isolation and loneliness, along with a decrease in the feeling of rejection.





By the end of the year, MOSTe scholars became more aware of having people they can count on for help when they have problems. They found individuals they trust and feel close to.
